COLLEGE PROFILE



Lajpat Rai DAV College, Jagraon is the embryo of Arya Samaj aimed at purging Hinduism of its defunct and regressive practices. After the death of Swami Dayanand Saraswati, his dedicated followers immortalized this great reformer by translating his dream of building an erudite nation on Vedic foundation into reality with the founding of Dayanand Anglo Vedic College Trust and Management Society which founded its first Institute at Lahore in 1886 with Mahatama Hansraj as its founding Principal. At present, we have 75 DAV Colleges & Universities, 800 DAV Schools and 50,000 employees working in these institutions. Fulfilling the dream of Swami Ji to eliminate illiteracy from this land of Vedas, LR DAV College, Jagraon was established in 1959 by RK Trust. With the passage of time, this college which started as an undergraduate college gradually evolved into a Post-Graduate premier institute providing education to rural as well as urban students running varied streams like BA, B.Sc., BCA, B.Com, MA (English, Punjabi, Economics & History), M.Sc (Mathematics), M.Com, and PGDCA as well as various Add-on courses in insurance Business and Computer Based Accounting. The session 2015-16 would be remembered as a red letter day in the history of the college since it was the year in which the college became a NAAC accredited college.

The institution founded in memory of Sh. Radha Krishan has been nurturing and nourishing young minds not only in the field of education but in the stage and podium too for the past 59 years. Our shining stars win a large numbers of accolades at various competitions organized at District, State, National and International levels. They have made their mark not only in civil services but in medical and engineering spheres too. Under the expert guidance of DAVCMC, New Delhi, the college is striving hard to reach the zenith of glory.

Every year we bag top positions in University Exams. Ball Badminton Team of the college won Gold Medal whereas our wrestlers won Bronze Medal in Inter college tournaments held at Panjab University, Chandigarh.

Compartment Cases

B.A./B.Sc.-I

A student placed in compartment in one subject only at +2 examination may be admitted to B.A./B.Sc.-I provided he/she has secured at least 35% marks in aggregate of all subjects for B.A.-I and at least 45% marks in aggregate of all subjects (theory & practical) for B.Sc.-I.

1. Submit the original Detailed Marks Card of SSC Part-II (+2 examination) at the time of admission. At least 20% marks must be obtained in the subject of compartment.
2. The candidate securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment of the +2 examination held in March 2019 is eligible to join 1st year of the degree course during session 2019-20, if she/he passes the examination on or before the last date given in the admission schedule of Panjab University, Chandigarh.
3. Compartment students may opt. in B.A./B.Sc.-I for the subject in which they have compartment but their admission will be provisional and be confirmed only after they clear the compartment subject falling which they will have to leave the course.

B.Com./BBA/BCA-I

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in +2 examination is not eligible for seeking admission to BCA-I/BBA-I/B.Com-I.

B.A./B.Sc./BBA/BCA & B.Com-II & III (3rd & 5th Sem.)

1. Students placed in Re-appear in B.A./BBA/BCA & B.Com-I & II year (I, II, III & IV Sem.) of Panjab University who wish to seek provisional admission in their next class on the condition that he/she to clear at least 50% of their total papers.

M.A.(English/Punjabi/Economic/History), M.Sc. (Mathematics)

1. A student placed in compartment in under-graduate class cannot get admission in M.A. of the same subject in which he/she is having compartment.

M.Com./PGDCA

1. A student placed in compartment category in any subject at under graduation level is not eligible to take admission to M.Com./PGDCA.

ELIGIBILITY FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

1. **Only those students are eligible to take a University Examination who obtain at least 40% marks in the aggregate of all subjects in class tests.**
2. The college may hold, at the discretion of the Principal, a special test for those students who fail to fulfill the conditions mentioned above. Such students shall be required to secure at least 40% marks in the aggregate of all subjects to be eligible to take the University Examination.
3. **Students of all classes, must have attended at least 75% of the total lectures delivered in each subject separately.** Students are advised to remain in constant touch with their class teachers, particularly if they have not been able to attend their classes in case of emergency and be sure that they do not fall short of lectures in any subject and do not miss class tests. If they remain absent, they will do so entirely at their own risk and responsibility. Parents/Guardians are advised to enquire about their wards from time to time.
4. A candidate who has completed the required percentage of lectures as a regular student may be allowed to appear in the University Examination as a private candidate in the following year, even if he/she did not qualify in the class tests.
5. A student who has failed in the last Annual Examination as a regular student, may take the same examination privately. However, if he/she joins the college as a regular student and fails to earn the eligibility on the basis of lectures and class test score he will be converted to private candidate category as per University Rules.

Migration

Original certificate of examination passed by the candidate from a University other than P.U. Chandigarh together with migration certificate must be submitted at the time of admission. No photo/attested copies shall be accepted. In case of inter-college migration, documentary proof of number of lectures attended in the previous college must be submitted along with the admission form.

Change of Subject or Faculty

- A student may, at the discretion of the Principal, be Permitted to change his/her subject or faculty on payment of ₹ 200/- or ₹ 400/- respectively within 15 days from the date of admission by applying on a prescribed proforma.
- No lecture attendance relaxation, however, will be allowed in the case of change of subject. However in case of change of faculty, the lectures shall be counted from the date of change allowed.

Casual Students

Casual students may be admitted at the discretion of the Principal. They are required to pay tuition fee and other usual fees and funds. Casual students are admitted only for full academic session and they shall pay the college dues and funds at the time of admission. They are not allowed to take part in any Co-curricular/Co-academic or P.U. Chd. (University) level youth festival activities. Such students have to apply to the university for examination on their own.

Attendance Rules

- Every student must have 75% attendance in each and every lecture, failing which his/her Roll No. may be detained i.e. he/she may not be allowed to appear in the University Examination.
- Attendance will be counted every fortnight.
- Attendance is compulsory on all college functions, seminars, workshops, extension lectures etc., whenever the students are directed to attend the same.
- A student who wants to leave the college has to intimate three months in advance and deposit the full dues after seeking Principal's permission.

Application Forms

Conditions of Loan

- The loan is not renewable ordinarily. The book may however be renewed if not in demand at the discretion of the librarian.
- The Librarian is empowered to recall any book at any time if necessity arises.
- Standard reference books, encyclopedias, dictionaries, year book, periodicals, newspapers etc. are not issued for outside use. These can however be consulted in the library.

5. A book which is on loan can be reserved for other members if they so desire. A book so reserved will be kept for the requesting member for three days after which, if not claimed, will be reserved for the next member.
6. **Overdues** - An overdue charge of Rs.1 per volume per day will be levied if a book is kept beyond the permissible period of loan. Book not returned on the due date laid down under notice or reported to have been lost shall be paid for immediately on the expiry of the prescribed limit of time and this amount shall in no case be refundable.

Losses

2. For a lost book, the borrower will have to pay the current market price of the book or replace the book with a new one.

- H Students are strictly prohibited to stand near the classrooms and in the corridors in their vacant periods.
- H Students are strictly prohibited to take part in any anti-govt., anti-college or any other type of subversive activity.
- H Outsiders are not allowed in the college campus.

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence, the decision of anti-ragging committee, and Discipline Committee will be final.

Any student found guilty of any or all the above mentioned offences may face :

- H Cancellation of admission.
- H Suspension from attending classes.
- H Withholding / withdrawing scholarship / fellowship & other benefits.
- H Debarring from appearing in any test/examination.
- H Withholding Results.
- H Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- H Fine & penalty as per college norms.

CAREER COUNSELLING & GUIDANCE CELL

This cell guides the students about the benefit of different courses and provides counselling sessions regarding the best course for them according to their aptitude. Frequent Seminars, Presentations, Workshops, Extension Lectures, Debates, Quiz and Competitions sponsored by UGC are organized for enlightening the students about career opportunities and for preparing students for competitive exams. The cell co-ordinates with companies for campus placement of students. It has a plan to organize a job fair in the ensuing session.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

Prof. Kunal Mehta and **Mrs. Pallavi Manik** are the Programme Officers of NSS. National Service Scheme has been introduced by Panjab University Chandigarh to provide opportunities to the students to gain valuable practical experience in the community service through programmes such as eradication of illiteracy, slum clearance, road building, voluntary health service, agriculture development etc. The aim of NSS is to develop amongst the students a sense of participation in nation building. Its motto is "Not Me, Not You, But We" and "Service above Self". Students having an aptitude for social service and rural upliftment can join NSS. Students are required to put in 120 hours or work in a year including a seven day camp. NSS volunteers who attend NSS camp regularly get a certificate which will give them an advantage in admission to higher classes.



Grievance Redressal Cell

The students are allowed to bring their genuine grievances in writing against any sort of functioning of the college in the notice of the Principal. A suggestion box has been placed outside the Principal's Office for the purpose. Time bound action is taken to redress the grievances of the students. Frequent meetings with students of every class are held by the Principal himself in order to have a personal interaction with them and to make them feel comfortable to express their problems and difficulties. These meetings prove to be a feedback in disguise.

Security Deposit

It is the sole responsibility of the student to withdraw his/her security deposit in the month of March of the following year, failing which the amount on the account shall be deemed to have been donated to college to be used for the welfare of the students and the student shall forfeit it all claim whatsoever in this respect.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The college is known for the emphasis it lays on the NCC training. Prof. Ramandeep Singh is the ANO of the NCC wing. Both boys and girls can opt for NCC depending upon their aptitude and physical fitness. As per NCC rules, a cadet is required to attend annual Training camp (ATC) of the unit each year and undergo service training for a minimum period of 65 hours of 96 periods or 32 parades during the academic session. The uniform issued to the cadets should be used with care. Any loss or damage shall be made good by them. Under the command of cadets remain active during the whole session. Parade is to be held on the scheduled dates after college hours. Certificates are issued to all the cadets.

Important Note

As per the University letter no. 2497-2657 / Mics / A-6 dated 11.04.2002, it is informed that the syndicate has approved weightage of marks to be given to NCC certificate holders as per following details :

Certificate A will have weightage of 1%

Certificate B will have weightage of 2%

Certificate C will have weightage of 3%

The maximum weightage of 4% for distinction in any or all the curricular activities shall be maintained.

Legal Literacy Cell

Legal Literacy Cell consisting of 25 students of the college with **Prof. Varun Goel** as in-charge was inaugurated by Civil Judge-cum Secretary, Legal Service Authority, Ludhiana. The purpose of the club is to spread legal literacy among students concerning areas like rights of women in property, cruelty against women/domestic violence, harassment of women at workplaces, female foeticide, drug addiction, corruption, bonded labour, RTI, rights of senior citizens, rights of children, with the help of painting, slogan making, street plays, debates and declamations, legal awareness camps, seminars etc. The LLC organised an interactive session of Prof. **Varun Goel** with the students of the college and DAV Centenary School, Jagraon regarding children rights. The club also arranged extension lecture on the problem of drug addiction among the youth of Punjab by Sh. Gurpreet Singh Toor, IPS.

Students Aid Fund

To help intelligent, deserving and economically poor students, a 'Students' Aid Fund' is maintained in the college. Financial assistance is granted to students in payment of college and University fee.

Departmental Libraries

Departmental Libraries fully equipped with the necessary books are available in the respective departments. Students can get books issued from the head of the concerned department as per rules and regulations of the department.

Alumni Association

Alumni Association has been a soothing support to the college. It aims at fostering the spirit of brotherhood and comradeship among the alumni as well as raising funds for various welfare schemes in the college. This association provides a forum for the alumni for exchange of ideas on educational, cultural, social and academic issues.

Students' Group Insurance

All bonafide students of the college are insured. In case of accident or any other mishap in the college or at sports fields or during an educational tour organized by the college on the wayside etc. Medical charges upto Rs.10,000 are defrayed. Students are advised to contact or report the matter to the Principal immediately after such an accident.

Registration of Mobile No.

Every student must fill up his mobile no. on the Application Form. This number will get registered with the college office. All information regarding fee, fine, absentees or any other important information will be sent through sms on this number. It is the responsibility of every student to check his/her message box everyday.

Hostel Facility

A fully secured hostel accommodation is available for the girl students of the college at very reasonable charges. The students are provided with a large number of facilities like reading & recreation room, hygienic food medical facility, water-purifiers, solar heater, well-lit, well-furnished and ventilated rooms, with utmost care of cleanliness & proper sanitation to make their stay comfortable and academically fruitful.

Students Council

Representatives of various classes are brought forward to form The Students Council that serves as a link between the students and the administration. Members of this council are provided an opportunity to join hands with the teachers as well as administration whenever the college organises any event or function. Hence, the council trains the students in many skills like communication, management, leadership etc. It also inculcates a sense of responsibility in its members.

AMENDMENT IN RULES

important :

Additions, alterations, modifications etc. in any of the rule/s and regulation/s of the college, Panjab University, Govt. or any authority as enumerated in the prospectus may be made and put into effect as and when desirable and required. Rule/s amended by appropriate authorities, including the Principal, will be final and legally binding on all students without favour or discrimination.

If a student fails to fulfill the conditions required by the University to appear in the Annual Examination, his/her Roll No. received provisionally can be withdrawn even one day before the commencement of the examination.

Students are always advised to look upon the college as their own, as their alma mater, as a temple of learning. 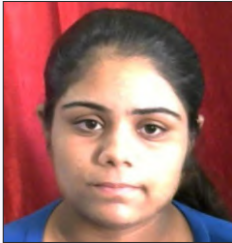

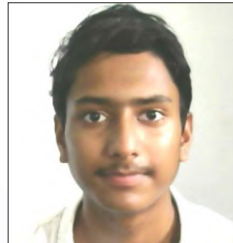
